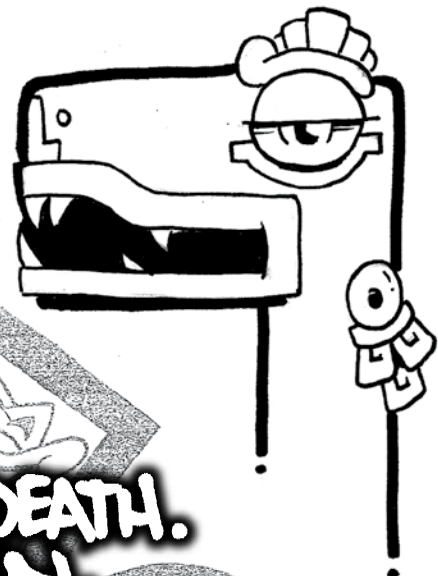
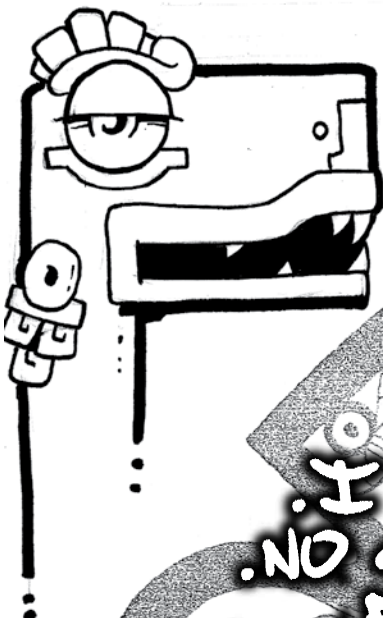

Casa Aztlán's Mission: Acknowledging the strengths of Mexican families, Casa Aztlán seeks to sustain the strong cultural identity and community of Pilsen by organizing, educating and providing supportive services in order to combat social violence, discrimination and poverty.

In 1970, Casa Aztlán was founded by Pilsen community activists in response to the emerging needs of the rapidly growing Mexican immigrant community in Chicago's lower west side. Frustrated with Pilsen's substandard city and county services, disproportionate high school dropout rates, labor abuses, poor health conditions and discrimination against Mexican immigrants and Chicanos, local activists decided self determination and grass-roots organizing was the best way to empower their community.

For the past 38 years, Casa Aztlán has advocated on behalf of the Mexican/Latino immigrant community in the areas of education, health care, immigration, labor rights and most vocally in the struggle for the rights of undocumented immigrants. We have become a gathering place for students, laborers, artists, educators, musicians, youth, and adults who care for their community and want to affect social change.
